

END OF CONVENTION REPORT, 22nd ANNUAL, BALTIMORE, MARYLAND

NATIONAL ATHLETIC TRAINERS ASSOCTATION

July, 1971

From: Ed Block, National Program Chairman

1. The 22nd Annual Convention of the National Athletic Trainers Association was the culmination of nine years of proposals by the Third District.

During the nine years endeavor, the Convention Division of the 2. Baltimore Area Convention and Visitors Council was invaluable. T suggest that future Program Chairmen or those making proposals for a convention should first inform their Convention Bureau. Since they are specialists, just about all convention information is at their fingertips and which otherwise would take weeks, months to discover. Besides, their motivation stems from the fact that they must attract conventions because that is their sole reason for existance. Thus, they are on your side from the very start and will help you in every way. Since most of us who assume the role of Program Chairman are "Rookies," it is important to take measures to avoid the pitfalls and to gain some professional competance as soon as possible.

The initial goal was to determine our needs. The first solution 3. was from our National Convention Director, Mr. Tom Healion, who sent a master outline of our normal convention needs. The second step was to construct a tentative list of speakers. Recourse was first made with four massive sources in this area: The National Institutes of Health, the Johns Hopkins Medical School, the University of Maryland Medical School and federal agencies fust forty miles away in Washington, D.C. There were so many resources available a guideline had to be established. Practical and frontier aspects of Athletic Training was the guideline of choice. By late 1969 and early 1970, a number of possible speakers were interviewed and a tentative list constructed. Of this list, the gem appeared to be the Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation Certification Course offered by the Maryland Heart Association. When the CPR Certification Course was chosen as the centerpiece of the program, it meant that a large area for practical work had to be available. The only area adequate was the Convention Hall of the Civic Center. This meant an additional fee. Mr. Dan Dever of the Heart Association came to the Denver Convention and presented an outline of the course, and the Board of Directors concurred that the Civic Center should be engaged. At the same time, Mr. Jack Gebhardt of the Convention Division also presented a report to the Board of Directors and there were no objections to his views.

4. Thus the facility needs stemmed from the program.

5. The Headquarters Hotel requirements were based upon an estimated 450-500 member registration. This, together with exhibitors, meant that we had to engage the largest hotel as headquarters, and we were fortunate enough to obtain reservations for about 400 rooms. The Lord Baltimore thus became Headquarters Hotel. Looking for possible

eventualities the Statler Hilton and the Holiday Inn, both within easy walking distance of the Civic Center, were alerted by the Convention Division. Thus, it was possible to accommodate the highest probable estimate of registrants. Since this was the first time that the National Convention was held on the East Coast, an estimate of attendance was always a problem.

5. Lack of estimate reliability had important effects upon the convention plans. For one thing, we found that we could not sell luncheons as was done at the Denver Convention and which proved so valuable. We could not establish a reasonable price. A cafeteria set-up at the Civic Center was the plan of choice.

6. Advertising of the Convention was by three newsletters. The first two were framkly advertising and the last one contained the program per se. Also, the American Hospital Association advertised for us through a former Head of Public Relations of the Colts now with the Hospital Association.

7. Jim Conboy, Program Chairman of the 1970 Convention at Denver, sent a vast amount of very valuable material including the "End of Conference Report of the 21st Annual NATA Conference." This material contained his experiences and samples of various projects. All this material was saved and will be forwarded to the next Program Chairman. In addition, he was very quick in answering various questions and advising throughout the planning stage and was so recognized.

8. Close liasion was kept with Tom Healion and later with Otho Davis. Jack Rockwell had been kept informed of developments until his change of position. The program committee (see attached list) did a magnificent job. Such close liasion is considered to be a necessity if the plans are to avoid the appearance and errors common to independent action of committee men.

9. Printing of the various programs were a problem and have been in the past and will present problems in the future. The first problem was amount. Upon the advice of both Jim Conbov and Tom Healion and later Otho Davis, one thousand of the various programs were printed. The other problem, which was never solved, was to keep the printed material accurate. There were last-minute changes, but some came after the program was printed and too costly to change at that time. Printing was delayed until three weeks before the opening of the convention in order to keep up with last-minute changes, but it had to be in the hands of the printer at that time. Time must be allowed for proofs, corrections through proof reading and a final proof reading of the copy to be printed. This constitutes an amazing amount of work, especially for an amateur. Help from the Colts' Public Relations Department was invaluable, but they had their own work to keep up with as well and their help was really beyond the call of duty. They deserve credit. Their names are Mr. Ernie Accorsi and Mr. Chip Campbell.

.

10. Exhibitor space was more than adequate with 90 booths available. The possibility existed that if the booths were sold it would help to defray the cost of the Civic Center.

11. Administration of clinical session speakers was organized by "Spider" Fry. He had all speakers report to the Registration Desk. There they were met by a representative of NATA and conducted to the lecture area. All speakers were notified by letter as to date, time, place and their visual material needs. This was done about three weeks before the convention.

12. Visual material projectors were supplied and operated by a professional medical photographer, Mr. Rick Sperry. He was also engaged to take the banquet pictures and was available for any other picture assignment.

13. "Spider" Fry also assigned members to introduce the speakers as well as to time them and keep the program moving in orderly fashion.

14. Administration was under the direction of Joe Gieck, District #3 Host Chairman.

EVALUATION OF CONVENTION PLANS

1. It was gratifying to note that plans for facilities as well as plans for the program adhered to those which had been developed prior to the convention. This points up the importance of developing workable plans. Many difficulties would have arisen needlessly had not the Convention Committee forescen possible difficulties.

2. Some instances of foreseeing difficulties were: Two other hotels in the vicinity of the Headquarters Hotel were alerted that a convention would be held and that they could expect registrations above there usual expectations; a number of visits were made to all facilities by Convention Committee members to see if there were any difficulties; all convention facilities have day-to-day changes since they have to book new conventions and small meetings which may interfere.

3. All speakers were written to several times prior to the convention to be certain that they would be available. A number of these speakers were world-famous and had many demands made upon their time. This was very important in foreseeing difficulties and it paid off in that not one speaker who had been engaged to lecture failed to appear.

4. Another example was that a list of speakers had been prepared who were to act as "back-up" speakers in case of the non-appearance of a scheduled speaker. In this connection it is important to have as many back-up people, subsystems, alternates, etc., as it is possible to think of. In addition a "Chairman-at-Large," in this case LeRoy Brandimore of the University of Hopkins, acted in this capacity. He was invaluable as there will certainly be many situations which will develop which can not be anticipated. Actually, all on the committee had "back-up" responsibilities, as for instance Fern Hitchcock of Western Maryland who suddenly found himself in the position of having to go to Andrews Air Force Base to pick up Astronaut Jack Lousma.

5. However, there were situations which arose and could not be corrected. The lack of air conditioning at the banquet was one of these problems. Some people did not like their hotel accommo-dations and had to move to other hotels.

6. Meeting rooms were adequate but in some instances could have been better.

7. Registrations of members were far better than anticipated. There were no "intolerable" waiting periods.

8. The space provided for the exhibitors was excellent and there were no formal complaints registered.

9. Unfortunately, "lunches" could not be sold as they were in the Denver Convention. However, a cafeteria was provided but members had to pay for their own meals. This cafeteria did keep a number of people at the convention who would otherwise have left and not returned but it could have been better.

10. Student trainers received a lot more attention than usual but this could be better. It may be possible to assign a student to one of the older members other than his own instructor.

11. The attendance at the Wednesday program was better than anticipated. Even in the Wednesday afternoon session there was a good contingent of members although it could have been better since the panel members appearing at the end of the program were all world-famous.

12. The printing turned out better than expected considering it was all done on a last-minute basis. The advantage here was that the printing company selected was the same one which did all of the printing for the Colt Football Team and there were established relationships.

13. The entertainment was almost more than adequate. There were so many organized entertainments as well as "Hospitality Rooms" it was almost a fight to find free time to do as you wished.

14. The clinical sessions programs were also better than anticipated. It was feared that too many speakers would aim their remarks to their own specialized audience and lose sight of the interests of Athletic Trainers.

SUMMARY

A great deal more could have been included in this "End of Conference Report of the 22nd Annual Convention," but it is too long as it is.

It is probably better to work with other questions on an individual basis. The Convention Committee will be happy to help in this regard. Just drop them the question and you will receive the best answer we have.
